### Democracy:

Democracy at Wentworth College takes many forms but at its heart are the fundamentals of participation, inclusion and attempting to influence the decision-making process in legitimate ways. #### The Rule of Law:

We believe that being treated with respect heightens pupils' self-esteem and confidence, which in turn contributes to academic and social success.

Tolerance of other beliefs and faiths is central to creating an environment that is underpinned by warmth, cooperation, understanding and support.
